

Independence California

WTF is a Frontier Fondo? You're well on your way and will soon experience the rugged natural wonders of the Eastern Sierras having left the safety of your comfy, air-conditioned SUV and going off road and into the wilderness. Like early travelers in the American West, you'll be in unfamiliar lands on a difficult path and encounter many hardships. For those pioneers that survive and reach journey's end, stories will be told of your grit and determination. Legends will be born and perhaps a piece of this land will be named in your honor.







Geology: the terrain here is unique, shaped by thousands of years of fracturing and twisting form sedimentation, erosion, volcanism, seismic forces, and glaciers.

Plants: Desert wildflower seeds hide in the sand for years, until a few drops of rain unfurl a colorful carpet across the desert, providing a hiding place for rattlesnakes to punish the unsuspecting influencer.

Wildlife: Keep an eye out for bighorn sheep, elk, and mule deer crossing the path. Nobody cares about your finish time at Whiskey Tango Fondo, but especially the large mammals with horns

History, Advocacy, Partnership with Sierra Club: Archeologists have found stone tools and projectile points to show that Eastern Sierras and Death Valley were first settled ten thousand years ago, with signs of fences from herding antelope and symbols chipped into rock formations. Owens Valley has been home to the Mono, Timbisha, Kawaiisu, and Paiute Native Americans.

The Old Spanish Trail (Route 16) is the trade route between the pueblos of

Santa Fe and Los Angeles which cut across a corner of Inyo County. The route was established in 1830 and looked like the 405 during the gold rush in the 1850s and 60s.

Farms, ranches and orchards thrived in Owens Valley until 1920, when water was diverted from the Owens River to supply the city of Los Angeles, through with the rights acquired through political fighting, "chicanery, subterfuge ... and a strategy of lies," overseen by William Mulholland. The Los Angeles Aqueduct drained Mono Lake and its ecosystem of migratory birds and brine shrimp, with lasting effects on the local economy.

Tourism and Hollywood brought awareness to the Eastern Sierras, with Gene Autry, John Wayne and scores of movies and shows from the Lone Ranger to the Great Trail Robbery filming in the region. The Museum of Western Film History is a popular attraction in Lone Pine and open all weekend.

Your participation and additional donations support the Angeles and Toiyabe Chapters of the Sierra Club, to preserve the outdoor spaces and the ongoing fight for water rights.







Pro Notes

You can expect some loose to very loose sections of the courses. A larger volume tire is highly recommended, it will help you stay on top of the dirt and float over the sandy spots on Foothill Road and Hogback climbs and keep you from sinking.

The alluvium Pro 700x45 GCT has a fast center thread pattern that will still be extremely fast on the road portions, Whitney Portal Rd and Tuttle Creek Rd, but with some good cornering knobs for the high speed portions on Movie Road.

If frame clearance is an issue, or you just want a bit more aggressive thread, the Booster Pro 700x40 GCT is a great option for a bit more traction and peace of mind on some of the steep ups and downs on the course. GCT casing adds a lot of puncture protection from the large rocks scattered around that area with very little extra weight.



BE PREPARED

Be Prepared For Anything.

Tools, Spare Tubes, Pump, Sealant, Food, Water, Electrolyte, Clothing, etc... Once you roll from the start line you need to be self-sufficient and ready for any scenario. Roads/trails take you into remote areas for Inyo National Forest, BLM & Inyo County lands. Vehicles cannot reach all sections of the course. We cannot simply come pick you up.

*All on-course support services can only meet you at Aid Station locations.

Course Support Services

Aid Stations

Volunteers at Aid Stations will have limited supplies/tools for simple repairs.

Mechanical Support

VeloFix Mobile Bike Repair can reach Aid Station locations to provide assistance with critical failures of mechanical equipment.

SAG Support

Staff/SAG Van can only pick up riders from Aid Stations. If you no longer wish to continue riding, you will need to find the nearest Aid Station and request a ride.

EMTs/Medical

Mobile EMTs can offer BLS (basic life support) and minor medical needs. Non-emergency medical requests should be directed to nearest aid station.

Weather

Be prepared to bake in the heat, freeze in the snow, or both. Conditions can change fast in the desert and the mountains. Check the forecast, pack accordingly.

TIME LIMITS

Course Cut Offs / Time Limits

WTF 100

Course Time Limit: 12Hrs
